In recognition of leadership in special education, Goodwill Industries of Michigan's Central Heartland, Inc. (GICMH)

> In addition, superintendents from four school districts in Battle Creek - where GICMH is headquartered each received checks for \$2,500, while Doris Klaussen Developmental Center in Emmett Township and the Battle Creek nonprofit Charitable Union each received checks for \$5,000.

The mission of GICMH is "changing lives through the power of work," a recent press release on behalf of

Goodwill stated.

The nonprofit concept started in the early 1900s in Boston by Edgar Helms and was brought to the Battle Creek area in 1953 by Doris Klaussen, a trailblazer in the field of special education.

As principal at Ann J. Kellogg Elementary School, she saw that vocations were limited for young people with severe disabilities who were leaving the public school system.

After establishing GICMH, she spent 45 years in various roles for the nonprofit, now part of a network of more

than 150 Goodwill Industries CEO of GICMH, said the organizations across the U.S., social enterprise wanted to Canada and 12 other countries.





every day." "It's very humbling and an honor that Goodwill is taking time to recognize the special education world and the needs of our students," said Dr. Sarah Parker, special education director of off-site programs at Eaton Regional of Education Service Agency (RESA). "Currently, we have federal dollars, so our budgets are limited on what we can spend. So having some nondiscretionary funds that go into a pot. ... that's really meaningful."

In Michigan, about 200,000 students receive special education services, making up nearly 14 percent of all stu-

dents. The Michigan Association of Intermediate School Administrators estimates a \$343 million special education shortfall for the fiscal year 2023.


Kathy Slee, principal and special education supervisor of Doris Klaussen Developmental Center, accepted the funds on behalf of the school, which is for students ages birth to 26 with moderate to severe physical or mental impairments.

"As a school, we do what we have to do. You can't help a student progress and grow if

"In a world that often underestimates the capabilities of individuals with disabilities, Goodwill Connects stands as a beacon of hope, providing pathways to meaningful employment. ... Together as educators, parents and advocates, we can continue to create a world where everyone is empowered to contribute to their community and share their unique gifts." For many students with dis-

abilities, post-graduation employment and independence can be a major challenge.

Newton, the mother of two boys on the autism spectrum, said Goodwill Connects was especially meaningful for her oldest son, who is now a senior at Harper Creek.

"The transformation I've witnessed since he joined is nothing short of remarkable," Newton said. "The pride he demonstrates when he tells ership of special education people that he's working is truly amazing. Through this program, he has not only gained practical work experience, but has also developed a profound sense of independence and responsibility."

It is through a network of community partners, such as GICMH can help remove barriers to employment for people with disabilities, according to the press release.

And for GICMH, it was important to take a night to recognize and support the nonprofit, as well as the leadteachers in southcentral Michigan.

Dr. Preston Hicks, vice president of workforce development and community partnerships at GICMH, concluded the ceremony by telling the honorees gathered: "This is tremendously powerful Charitable Union, that work you do. ... We thank you for it."
